BLAKELY WINS 100-MILE RACE

Distance Is Made in One Hour Twenty-
Six Minutes Ten Seconds.

ORMONDE-DATONIA BEACH, Fla., Jan.
24.—The one hundred-mile event for the
Minneapolis Cup was won today by E. B.
Blakely, driving a seventy-horse-power gaso-
line car in 1:26:10. Blakely, though 11
minutes behind Earp's record of last year,
drove a pretty race, distancing every com-
petitor. Hutton, in an English gasoline car,
finished second, 36 minutes behind the win-
ner.

The ten-mile handicap, open to cars of all
classes and power, was won by Blakely in
the same car in which he drove to victory in
the one hundred-mile event. Blakely had a
handicap of 45 seconds, and covered the dis-
tance in 8:44, the fastest time in the event.
Rogers, in the scratch car, a twenty-five-
horse-power steamer, finished fifth, making
the ten miles in 9:20 2-5.

The five-mile event for touring cars listed
between \$1,500 and \$3,000, was won by Kull
in a thirty-five-horse-power gasoline car in
5:52 1-5.

An effort was made by Marriott in the
steam racer in which he last year made the
mile in 28 1-5 seconds to lower that record.
The attempt failed, his time today being
31 4-5 seconds.

Other mile trials were run principally to
determine handicap in events yet to come,
but no unusual time was made save that of
F. E. Stanley, who drove a fully equipped
touring car a mile in :45 2-5. All events
will be concluded tomorrow if possible and
the tournament ended.
