GERMAN CAR TAKES 125 MILE RACE AT ORMOND

Louis Bergdoll Leads Way to Amateur
Auto Pilots, Covering Distance
In 1:13:30 1-5.

ORMOND, Fla., March 4.—The 125-mile
race for amateur drivers marked the second
day of the Ormond-Daytona beach tourna-
ment today, and it was won by Louis J.
Bergdoll in a German car. The winner cov-
ered the distance in 1 hour 13 minutes 30 1-5
seconds, bettering his time for the same dis-
tance yesterday by over seventeen minutes.

Bergdoll did not get the lead in the race
until the seventy-mile post had been passed,
when S. B. Stevens, driving a sixty-horse-
power American car, went out of the race
owing to a broken rocker arm. At the time
of the accident Stevens was leading by four
minutes, forty-eight seconds. The other en-
trant, R. G. Kelsey, driving a fifty-horse-
power American car, did not get beyond the
fifty-mile post when engine trouble put him
out of the running for good. The driving of
Stevens, though he lost the race, was the
feature, his car covering fifty miles in 41
minutes 37 seconds, close to the record time,
and holding that clip until the accident.
