Rain Mars Record-Breaking Attempts at Ormond Beach.

ORMOND, Fla., January 26.—Samuel B. Stevens, a wealthy young iron manufacturer of Rome, N. Y., has saved the speed tournament on the beach here. Because of a heavy rainstorm in the morning and an encroaching tide in the afternoon there was less than an hour's racing on the beach yesterday. Besides the contest in which Mr. Stevens won the amateur championship and the George W. Young trophy, only one other race was held. This was a handicap for touring cars, in which a light Stanley steamer scored an easy first. The summaries:

Fifteen-mile race for American touring cars, handicap, according to price—Durbin (15 H. P. Stanley), with twenty-five seconds start, first, 13:42 2-5; J. E. Bristol (30 H. P. Stoddard), with twelve and one-half seconds start, second in 17:11 2-5; D. D. Holmes (40 H. P. Wayne), scratch, third.
