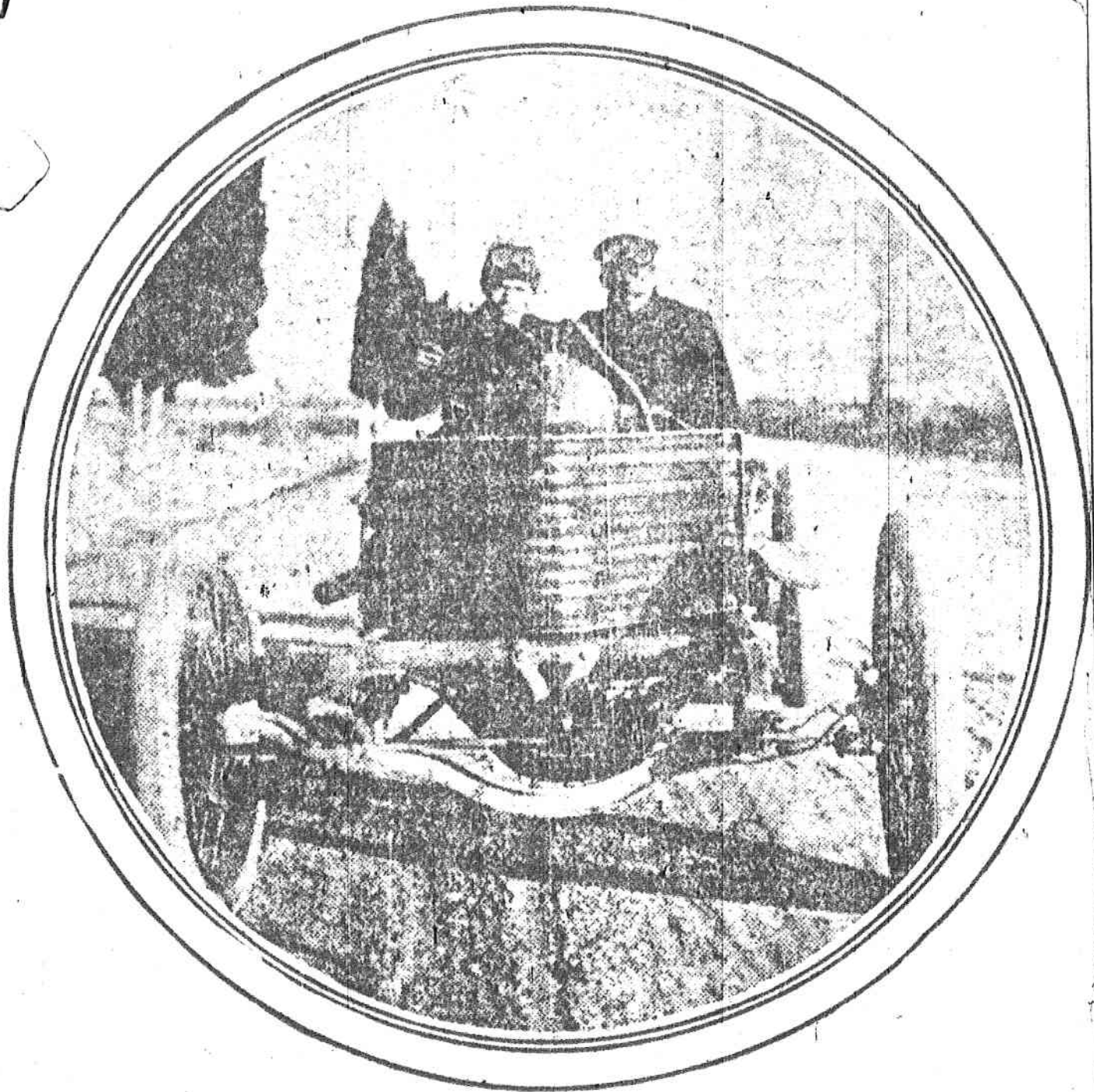


ONE OF CONTESTANTS FOR TITLE OF SPEED KING AT AUTO RACE MEET

He represents France in the great speed test against Marriott, the American, who drove a mile in 28 1-5 seconds.

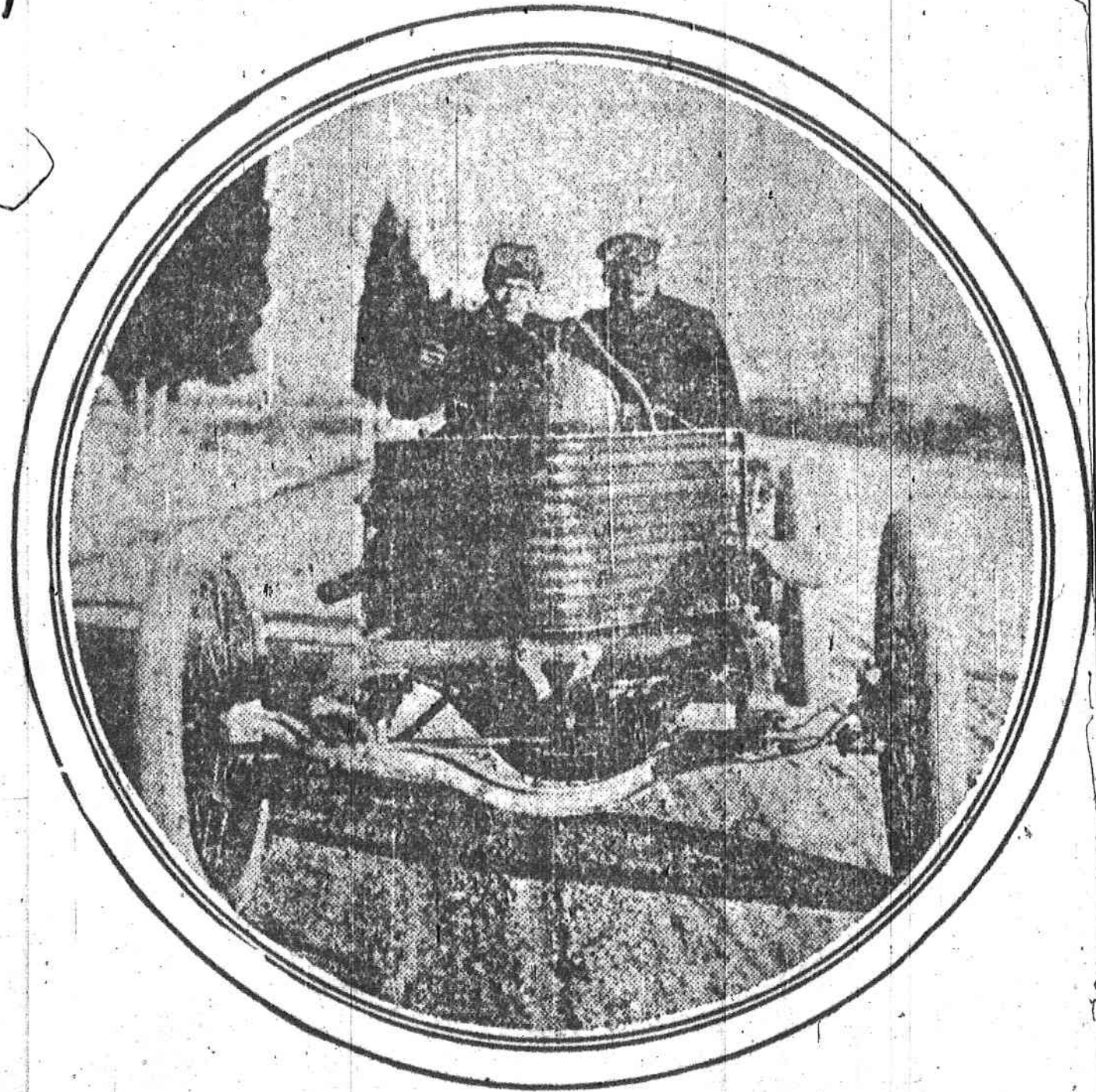

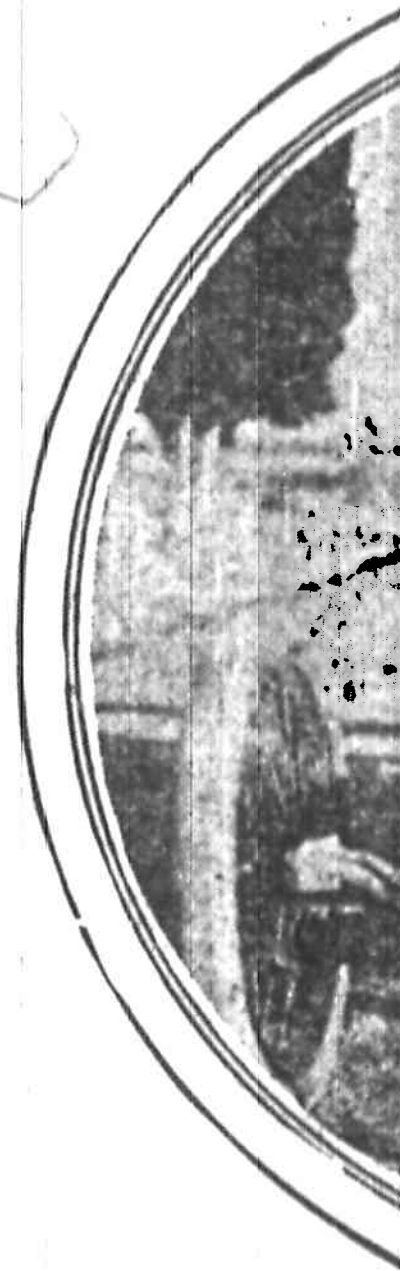

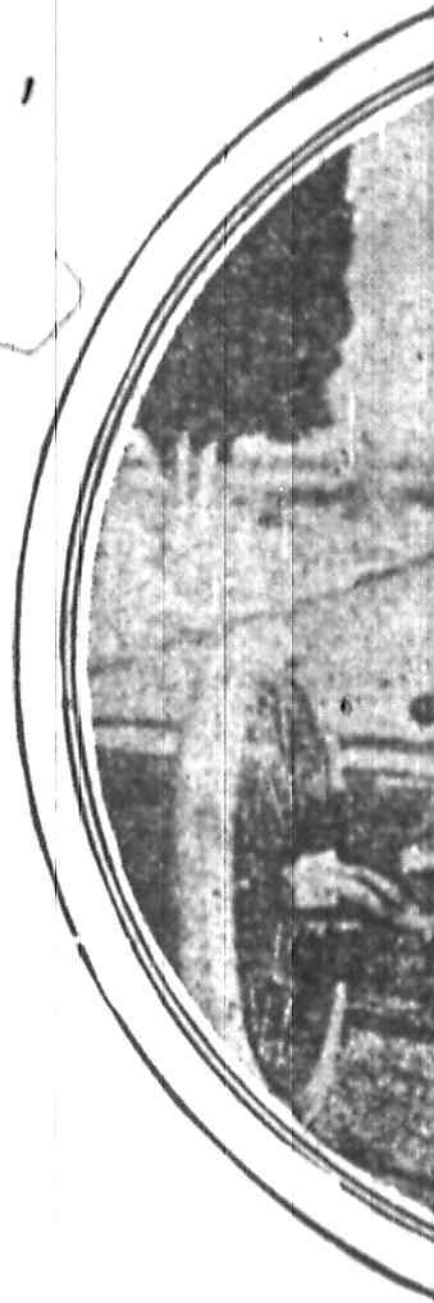

In the afternoon, besides the speed king race, there is scheduled three ten-mile races and a one-mile race for middleweight gasoline cars.
