## PLANS MOTOR GAME THAT IS DIVERSION

A. R. Pardington Invents an Auto  
Hunt for New York Ma-  
chine Owners.

### PLAYERS FOLLOW THE SCENT

Seekers for "Game" Ride in Cars,  
Trailing by Means of Pa-  
per Slips.

A. R. Pardington, chairman of the automobile division of the Queensborough bridge celebration, in New York, has conceived the motor hunt, the latest form of motoring diversion. A motor hunt, as the name implies, will take the hunter over much ground to unexpected places or, in short, to all points where the scent may lead or the "game" may be in hiding.

The "game" in connection with the Queensborough bridge celebration event is in the form of cards, showing that the hunter has visited an official control or cover. The person who at night time hands into the committee the greatest number of these cards will be declared the winner of the hunt and will receive a silver trophy valued at \$250 and either cash or plate amounting to \$100, the latter going to the driver of the car. As an additional check on the movements of the hunter, at each control or cover his

an additional check on the movements of the hunter, at each control or cover his card of identification will be presented and punched on the number corresponding to that of the station visited.

#### Agree on Grounds.

In order that the event may be successful certain limits to the hunting ground have been agreed on, all of which are over good macadam roads suited to the motor car. The hunting area contains about 300 square miles.

In hotels, garages, roadhouses, real estate offices and other suitable points the controls or covers will be located. There will be 100 of them. No particular order or system will be followed in establishing these points. This is purposely done so that clues as to the different locations will not be easy to obtain in advance. A weather proof card, yellow in color, with black printing, will indicate the control or cover.

A banner or flag of good size, of yellow hunting with black center, either in the form of a star, square or other distinguishing emblem, will also mark control of cover, being posted in a conspicuous place.

#### Use Sealed Envelopes.

The contest will begin from the Manhattan end of the Queensborough bridge promptly at 8 o'clock on the morning of June 15, and will end at the same hour in the evening of that day. A strong envelope to contain the control cards secured during the day will be furnished each contestant. These envelopes are to be sealed when returned at night time and will later in the evening be opened by the committee in charge, counted and the awards for the day made.

In connection with the motor hunt, for which entrants in that event are eligible, will be another contest in which the principal figure will be a car suitably labelled roving at will in the hunting area in the manner of game bewildered by the close pursuit of hounds. This car will keep on the road continuously traveling at moderate speed, and the representative of the committee riding therein will surrender to each contestant met a card of distinct design or color. The driver securing the greatest number of those cards during the twelve hours will receive a trophy valued at not less than \$100.

In order to guard against speeding it is positively announced that it will be impossible for all of the controls or covers to be visited by any one car during the twelve hours. The winners of this event will take care and patience and not speeding, as controls or covers may be half a mile, a few yards or as many as five miles apart. There will be no blind controls established. Contestants who during the event have been convicted of exceeding the speed limit will be absolutely disqualified.
