PARRY CAR IN NEW YORK.

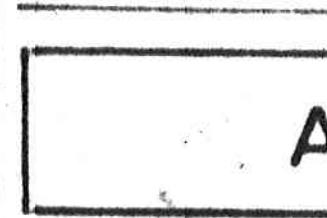
Another Indianapolis Product Creates Favorable Impression at Show.
