# COL, ALBERT A POPE DIES AFTER LONG ILLNESS

WAS A PIONEER IN MANUFAC-TURE OF BICYCLES.

#### CHAMPION OF GOOD ROADS

BOSTON, August 11.—Colonel Albert A. Pope, the pioneer bicycle manufacturer of the United States, and well known as one of the first advocates of the existing good roads system, died at his summer home

in Cohasset late yesterlay.

Colonel Pope had been ill for months, due to the breakdown of his nervous system, which followed the financial embarrassment of his bicycle company, the largest concern of the kind in the country, which had its headquarters in Hartford,

Colonel Pope was born in Boston May 20, 1843, and received his early education in the public schools of Brookline. His father met financial reverses and the lad went to work for a Brookline farmer. At the age of fifteen he went to work in the Quincy market and three-years afterward, when the rebellion started, he enlisted in the Thirty-fifth Massachusetts infantry.

He rose rapidly from the ranks, and when the regiment was mustered out he was prevetted lieutenant colonel for gallant conduct at the battles of Fredericksburg, Knoxville, Poplar Springs Church and Petersburg, On his return from the war he engaged in making shoe manufac-urers' supplies.

When, in-1876, the first imported bicycles came into this country, Colonel Pope fore-saw an opportunity of building a great fortune by the manufacture in the United States. He founded the Pope Manufactur-ing Company and became a millionaire through the medium of the bicycle. When the "craze" subsided and the au-tomobile supplanted the wheel in public favor the company began to get into diffi-culties. The Pope Motor Company was organized as a subsidiary corporation to the Pope Manufacturing Company and started to manufacture automobiles. Financial troubles beset both concerns and in panic times they were forced into the hands of a receiver.

Although Colonel Pope was much in the public eye, he never aspired for public office. He was, however, named several times as a possible candidate for elective positions.

He was a director for many years in a number of banks and corporations. He was a member of the Loyal Legion society, of the Society of the Cincinnati, and many other organizations. He was a visitor on the boards of Wellesley college, Lawrence scientific school and Harvard.


