**PREST-O-LITE VICTIM IS
 AWARDED \$10,000 DAMAGES**

Former City Fireman Edward Foullois
 Given Verdict by Jury in Cir-
 cuit Court.

After five hours' deliberation a jury in
 Circuit Court yesterday returned a ver-
 dict awarding Edward Foullois, a former
 city fireman, \$10,000 damages against the
 Prest-O-Lite Company on account of in-
 juries caused by the last of a series of
 three Prest-O-Lite explosions. The argu-
 ment in the case was concluded yester-
 day morning and the case went to the
 jury shortly before 10 o'clock.

Foullois, at the time of the explosion
 on the morning of June 6, 1908, was seated
 outside the engine house on South street.
 The force of the explosion, it was al-
 leged in his complaint against the Prest-
 O-Lite Company, caused a concussion of
 his brain. The explosion also displaced
 a part of the cornice of the engine house,
 it was alleged, which fell and struck him,
 causing internal injuries. It is said that
 the fireman will never recover fully.

 that the explosion was not caused by any
 negligence on the part of employee and
 that it was operating its acetylene gas
 plant in a building that had been ap-
 proved by city officials.
