HEAVY OPENING CONTINUES FALL ON STOCK MARKET

Losses of 1 to 4 Points Are Registered by the Leaders of the List

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—After a rally from yesterday's crash, the stock market was again subjected to heavy selling during the late trading this afternoon.

NEW YORK, Feb. 2.—Stocks continued heavy and feverish at Friday's opening in the absence of encouraging developments in the international situation. Losses of 1 to 4 points were registered by such prominent specialties as Atlantic Gulf and West Indies, Texas company and Industrial Alcohol, while other issues notably Erie and Crucible Steel were under Thursday's lowest levels.
