

RICKENBACKER HINTS EARLY RESUMPTION OF 500-MILE RACE

COLUMBUS, O., Aug. 2 (AP)—Racing will be resumed at the Indianapolis Speedway as soon as the war is over, Edward Rickenbacker, president of the Speedway Corporation, said last night.

"Who knows, maybe the war with Japan will be over this year and the cars will be running next year," he added. Rickenbacker said "normal" preparations of the track were under way.

Rickenbacker, here for the premiere of "Captain Eddie," motion picture based on his life, revealed the American Legion's 40 and 8 of Indianapolis took an option on the track last fall but the "deal fell through" after about sixty days of dickering. He said "difficulties in the Legion setup" halted the transaction.
