RACE DRIVER TAKEN IN SHANK'S CRUSADE

Mayor and Party of Police Round Up Seven Men Accused of "Speeding."

Mayor Shank led another band of "speed crusaders" yesterday afternoon, and when he went home for dinner seven sad-faced and wiser men, including a driver entered for the 500-mile race, had seen the inside of police headquarters. It was unfortunate, said the mayor, but he just had to do it.

The race driver arrested was R. C. Gilhooley, relief pilot of one of the Isotta-Franchini cars. He was in a touring car on the Crawfordsville road and was going to the Speedway, accompanied by a party of friends. He drove at the rate of thirty miles an hour, according to the mayor and his aids.

Another attache of the racing fraternity fell into the clutches of the "crusaders." He was Joseph H. Byrne of New York, an employe of Bob Burman, who has several cars here. He was driving one of the Burman cars on the Crawfordsville road also, and is alleged to have driven at the rate of thirty miles an hour.

The Crawfordsville road was the especial object of the mayor and his party, which included Superintendent of Police Hyland, Chauffeur Rugenstein and Bicyclemen Bastin and Giles.
