...orally, in view of a certain condition, with the speed attained abroad, and the race was marred by only one thing. Even the fence of the new Motor Parkway, which was completely vindicated as the scene of a race, did not suffice to keep the crowds off the course, and it was little less than a miracle that no one was killed. In the race itself a new record was established in another respect than that of speed, for not a single contestant or spectator was hurt until the contest was over.

The race was a truly international one, and on Thanksgiving day the best cars of America will again face Europe's speediest machines.

STRANG TO GO AFTER RECORD.

Will Attempt to Lower Mark for Twenty-Four-Hour Event.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—Lewis Strang reaches Savannah for practice spins over the course there in preparation for the Grand Prize race on Thanksgiving day, when he will make an attempt to lower the record which George Robertson made in the Simplex at the second twenty-four-hour race at Brighton Beach. During the hours which Robertson tore about the old Brighton race track he covered about 1,117 miles, which is the American record.

Strang hopes to do better than this, and accordingly will make his try, beginning tomorrow night, at New Orleans. Strang's machine will be the 35-45-horse-power Renault, in which he finished second in the Motor Parkway Sweepstakes race. Leo Anderson, who was in the Renault with Strang in the Vanderbilt Cup race, will be Strang's mechanic in New Orleans.

WANT VANDERBILT TO ACT.

Savannah Officials Show All Signs of Former Feud Are Passed.

NEW YORK, Nov. 7.—W. K. Vanderbilt Jr. was requested to act as referee at the Grand Prize automobile race in Savannah on Thanksgiving day and declined because of ill health. The invitation was extended by E. L. Morrell, chairman of the contest committee of the Automobile Club of America. Vanderbilt's physician advised against the acceptance of a post that would entail considerable exertion, following so closely upon the big race on Long Island.
