### Owners Withdraw Sunbeam Specials From Auto Races

Indianapolis, Ind., May 26.—One hundred and sixty thousand dollars ascended in smoke. That about represents the amount of money the Sunbeam company has expended during a period of five years in an endeavor to win an Indianapolis 500-mile race.

The Sunbeam cars were withlrawn from the 500-mile race to be run on the Indianapolis motor speedway May 31, by Louis Coatalen, chief engineer and managing director of the Sunbeam factory, who made a statement to speedway officials that he had made the discovery, in a final check, that the engines were oversized and incligible for the race.

Shortly after the withdrawal of the cars, Mr. Coatalen departed for New York so as to get closer cable connection with the Sunbeam fac-tory at Wolverhampton. The with-drawal caused much discussion among automobile and race men, for it is hard to understand how an engineer of Coatalen's reputation could possibly overlook the oversize in cars that have been raced for quite a period.


