The two organizations have been at odds for some time, the tension having increased lately over the rules for the Vanderbilt Cup race, against which several foreign automobiling organizations have addressed protests to the Automobile Club of America, which was the foreign report of the American Automobile Association up to the time of its withdrawal from the

national organization some time ago.

The racing board of the American Automobile Association comprises the Vanderbile Cup Commission and the foreign protests having been turned over to it, today's meeting was called to consider them.
