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1. The Vanderbilt Cup race shall be open to cars of subclasses 1 (451 to 600 cubic inches piston displacement), and 2 (301 to 450 cubic inches piston displacement). In class B, under the classifications of the A. A. A. racing rules for 1909.

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2. A cup will be offered for class 3 (231 to 300 cubic inches piston displacement) and another for class 4 (161 to 230 cubic inches piston displacement) under the same classifications, these races to be run at the same time and on the same course, but for shorter distances.

If the Vanderbilt race is held, it will be run over the part of the Long Island Motor Parkway used in the cup event of 1908 with probably the same county and town roads. There is a possibility of the course being shortened by about four miles. This would greatly simplify the matter of proper guarding and enhance the event from a spectator's standpoint. The race will be under the sanction of the A. A. A.
