Of the eleven drivers who had their cars out for warming up, only two, John Aitken in a National, and William Haupt, driving an American, made better than fifty miles an hour.

That Saturday's race will prove a record breaker is shown by the time the cars have made under unfavorable conditions in practice. With few exceptions the smaller cars have negotiated the 12.64-mile circuit at better than sixty miles an hour, and, as for the big cars, no one seems to know as yet just what they will do, as their drivers are holding them in check.
