# FOURTEEN CARS READY FOR VANDERBILT RACE

ELIMINATORY CONTESTS ON  
LONG ISLAND TO-MORROW.

WILL BE FIVE WINNERS

NEW YORK, September 21.—Fourteen  
autos will start in the Vanderbilt cup  
eliminator race to-morrow, unless with-  
drawals are made in the interim. Eleven  
were out for practice yesterday, but a  
heavy fog prevented record driving. All  
is in readiness for the races, and the in-  
dications are that the entire length of  
the course, 29.7 miles, will be alive with  
people on foot and in vehicles. Five  
American machines will represent Ameri-  
ca in the Vanderbilt cup race over the  
same course, October 6.
