The Nordyke & Marmon Company to-
day forwarded their entries to New
York for the Vanderbilt race, to be run
October 30. Two cars are entered, both
of them stock models of the Marmon
Thirty-two. One is entered in the big
race for the Vanderbilt cup, and the
other in one of the shorter races for
the Whitley-Hills trophy.

The drivers will be Stillman and Har-
