INDIANAPOLIS CAR TO FRONT

The wonderfully consistent performance of the Marion car, of Indianapolis, was one of the most striking incidents in connection with the recent twenty-four-hour race at the Brighton beach motordrome. Never during the twenty-four hours was it necessary for the drivers to take it from the truck on account of mechanical troubles. In the twenty-four hours the Marion covered 207 miles.

After the race the car was looked over carefully, prior to sending it to the Vanderbilt cup course for practice for the classic event, which takes place Saturday. It was on account of the fine showing made in the twenty-four-hour race by the car that Charles H. Reiss decided to enter it in the cup event.

The car was very easy on tires and only four new tires were used during the race. The tire on the left front wheel was not changed during the entire twenty-four hours.
