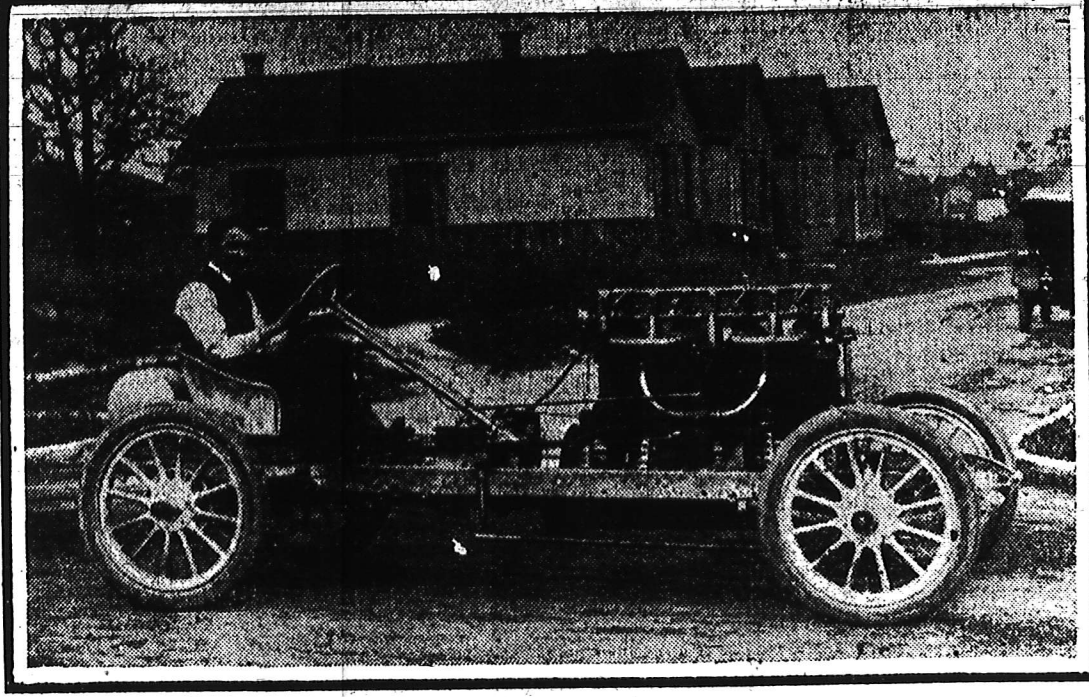


Entered in Automobile Race Meet for Russell Relief Fund.

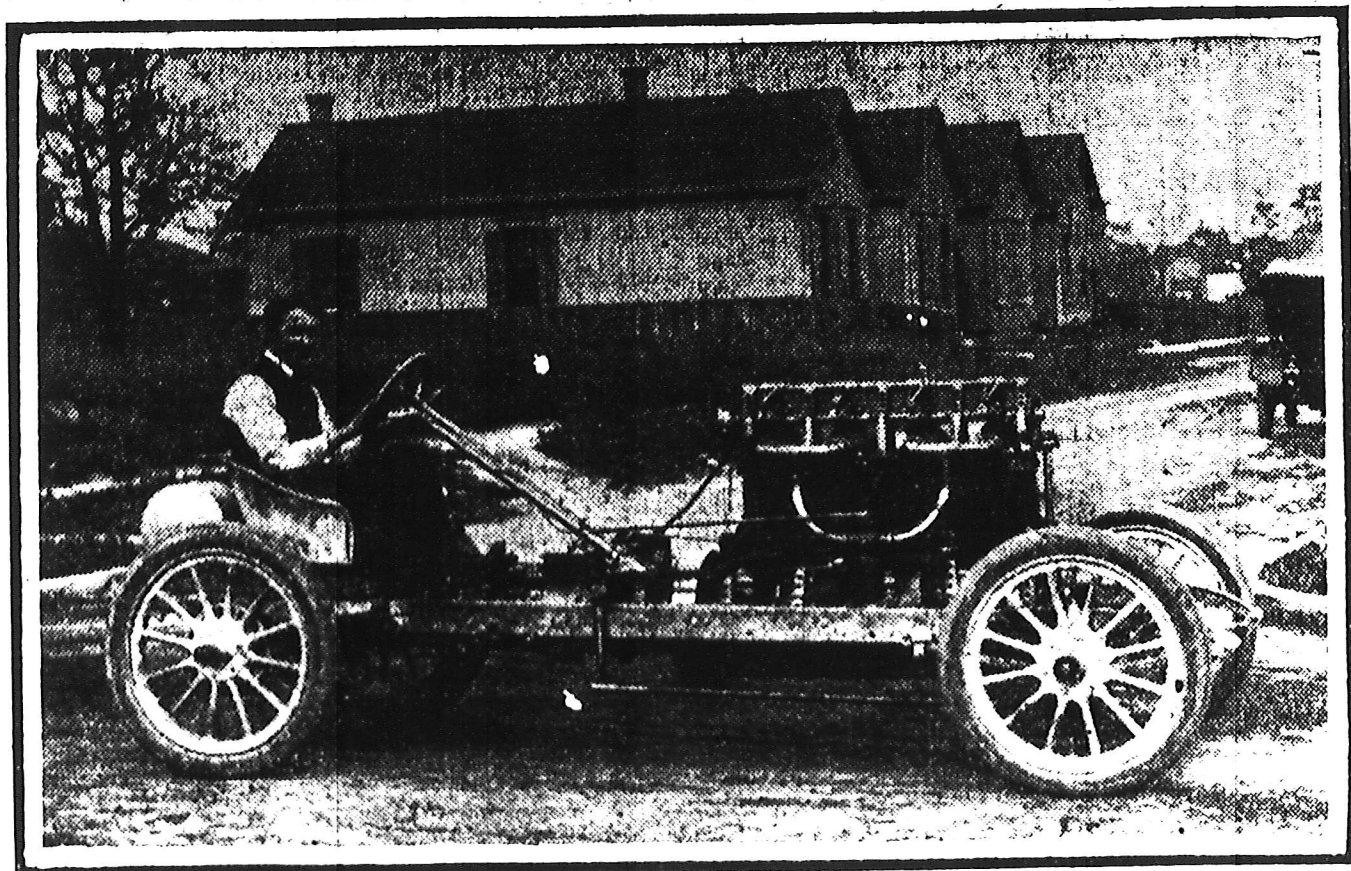

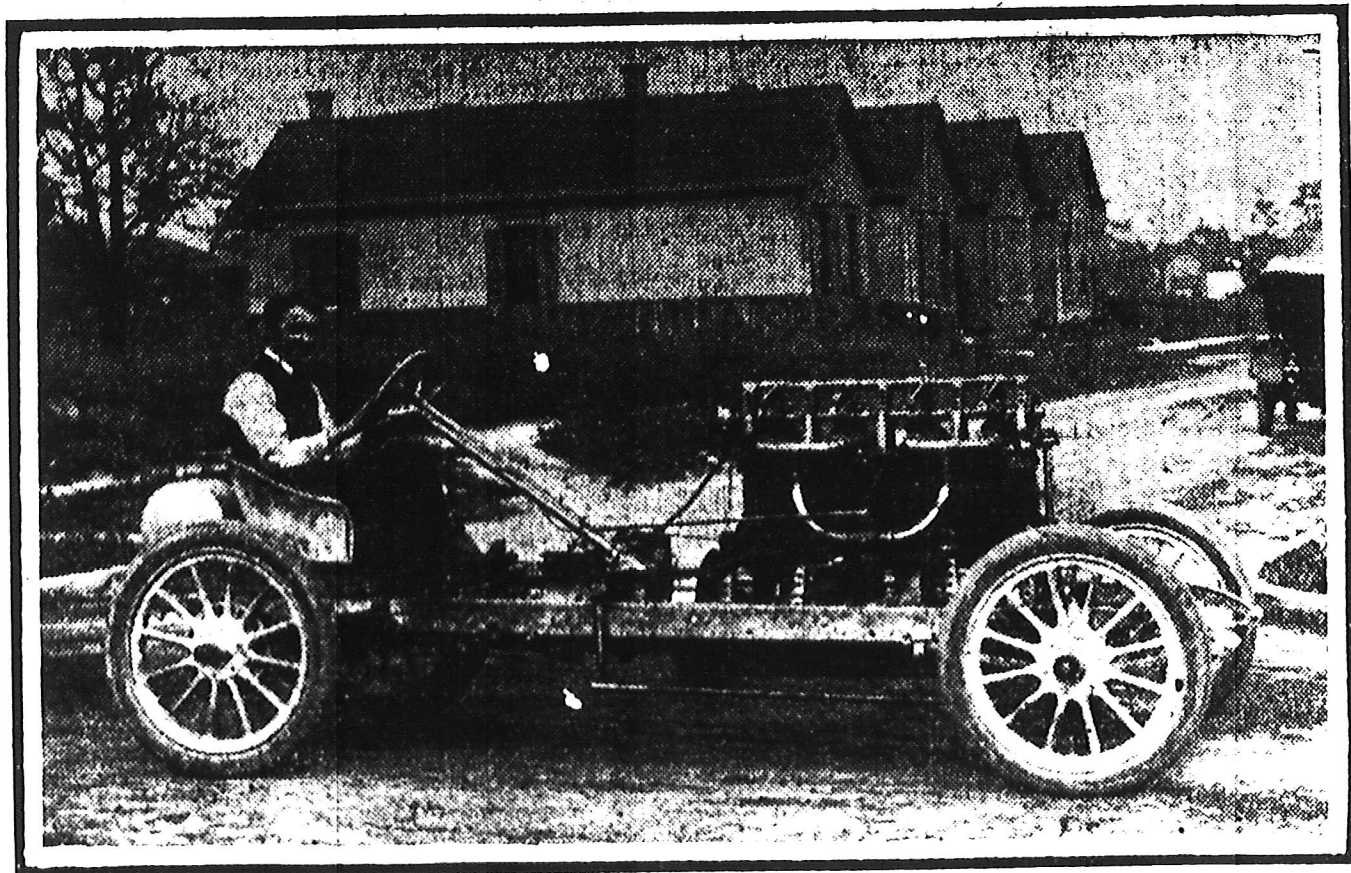
