AUTOMOBILIST IN COURT.

F. H. Wheeler Charged with Fast Driving and Assault and Battery.

Frank H. Wheeler, of the Wheeler & Schebler Carburetor Company, was in the police court today, charged with fast driving and assault and battery, as the result of an accident at Virginia and Lexington avenues, yesterday afternoon.

Wheeler was driving an automobile when he struck George Powell, a tin and sheet iron contractor, at 335 Virginia avenue, who was riding a bicycle. Powell was painfully but not seriously injured. Wheeler took him in his machine to the office of Dr. Ward, at 339 Virginia avenue, where the man's injuries were dressed.

Word of the accident was sent to police headquarters and bicyclenmen Mullen and Hunter were sent out to investigate. They found Wheeler and Powell in the physician's office. Witnesses told the police that Wheeler was driving at a speed of about forty miles an hour on the left side of the avenue. Powell was riding his wheel in the same direction on the right side, and when he reached Lexington avenue he crossed over and rode directly in front of the automobile. He was knocked some distance.

Wheeler said he could not avoid the accident, as Powell rode in front of him. He said the machine was not running above the speed limit. Powell was unable to be in court and the cases against Wheeler were continued until August 11.
