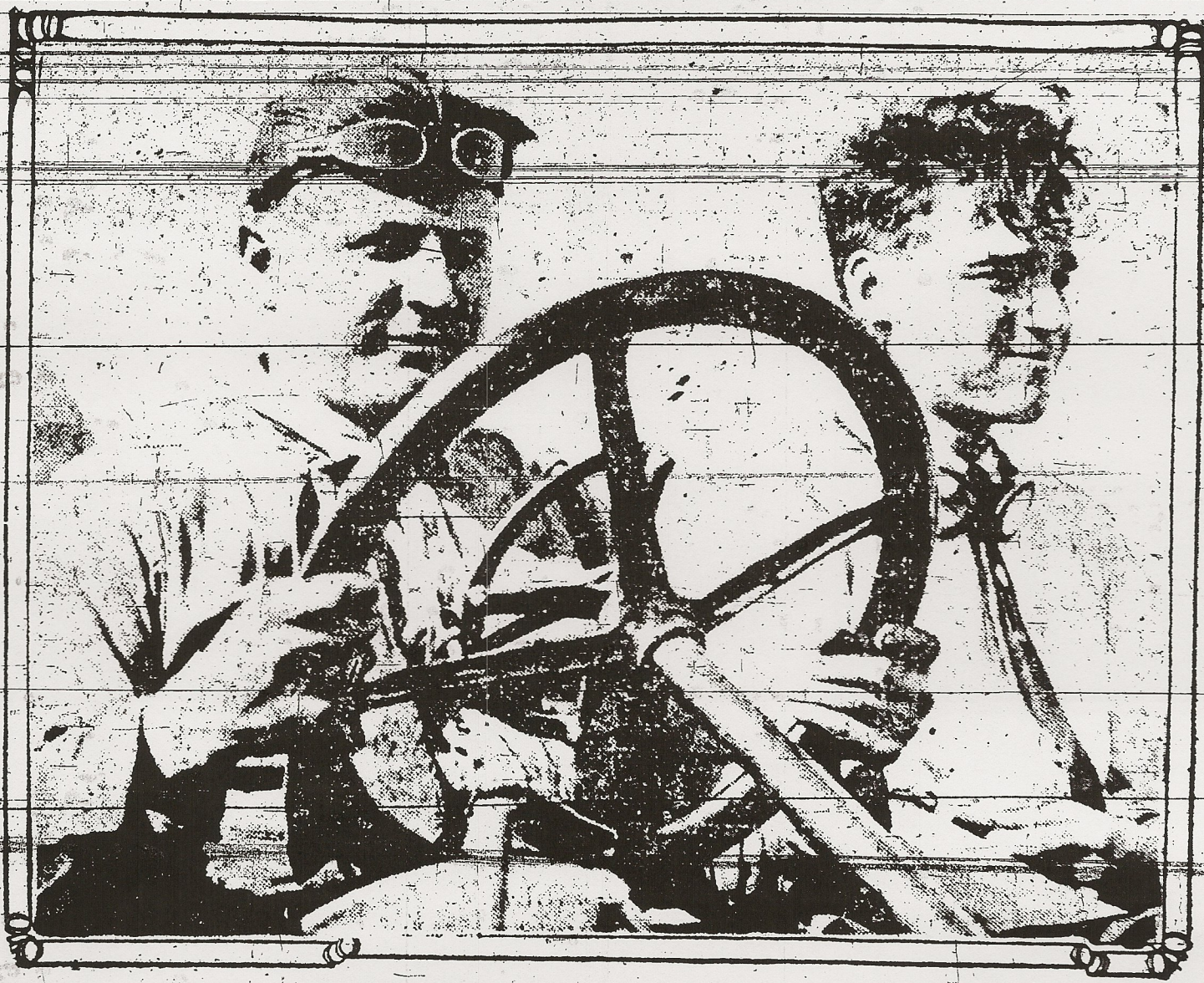


...the Senate, which meets tomorrow for adjournment day, summon the witnesses before the bar of the Senate for contempt.
