NO CAMPAIGN FUNDS FROM CORPORATIONS

Finance Committee of Republican State Organization to Decline Such Assistance.

TO RAISE MONEY ELSEWHERE

Chairman E. M. Lee Believes Large Sum Unnecessary and Will Practice Economy.

The finance committee of the Republican state committee, at its first session in this campaign, decided yesterday not to accept contributions to the Republican campaign fund from corporations.

The action of the committee is in line with that of the last finance committee. During the six years that James P. Goodrich was state chairman the Republican state committee did not accept a dollar from a corporation. The new organization believes the same policy should be carried out and will adhere to its decision throughout the campaign, notwithstanding the committee realizes that it is not going to be an easy matter to raise funds.

Ways and means were discussed at yesterday's meeting and a definite line of procedure was mapped out, although the members of the committee nor Chairman Edwin M. Lee, who met with the committeemen, would divulge the plan of action. Individual Republicans, however, will be solicited for funds, and it is not unlikely that the state will be apportioned among the members of the committee and a systematic canvass made.
