CIRCUIT AUTO RACES ON

COLE, MARMON, 'PARRY WIN

INDIANAPOLIS CARS CAPTURE HONORS IN FIRST DAY'S EVENTS AT CHURCH-ILL DOWNS—HARRY ENDICOTT SMASHES E-M-F.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., July 8.—The Grand Circuit automobile races opened at Churchill Downs' track this afternoon with eight events. Ray Harroun, the Marmon star, captured the greater number of honors. Hughie Hughes, the Parry star; Bill Endicott in a Cole "thirty," Walter Emmons in a Herreshoff and Dawson in a Marmon, were also winners. The racing attracted a good-sized crowd. There was one accident. Harry Endicott in an E-M-F crashed through the fence at the three-quarter turn in the second event. His car was badly smashed, but he escaped with only mild cuts on the hand and arm and a bad shaking up. He said tonight his car would be repaired and started in tomorrow's races.

The feature of the day was a twenty-five-mile combination race, in which two classes of cars started at the same time. The large class was won by Ray Harroun in a Marmon, while Bill Endicott in a Cole "thirty" won the small-car event. The track was slow, but Harroun made his twenty-five miles in 28 minutes. The summary:

First Race (five miles, 160 cubic inches piston displacement)—McCormick (Herreshoff), won; Emmons (Herreshoff), second; Smith (Herreshoff), third. Time, 6:45. This was run in a drizzling rain.

Second (five miles, 161 to 230 class)—W. Endicott (Cole 30), won; Edmunds (Cole 30), second. Time, 6:17. H. Endicott in an E-M-F went into the fence in this race.

Third (five miles, 231 to 300 class)—Dawson (Marmon), won; Hughes (Parry), second; Stinson (Black Crow), third. Time, 5:56.

Fourth (five miles, 301 to 450 class)—Harroun (Marmon), won; Dawson (Marmon), second; Gilchrist (Stoddard-Dayton), third. Time, 6:05.

Fifth (five miles, handicap for cars under 300 piston displacement)—Emmons (Herreshoff), 1 minute 10 seconds, won; Hughes (Parry), 25 seconds, second; Endicott (Cole 30), 35 seconds, third. Time, 5:17. Eight starters.

Sixth (five miles, free-for-all)—Harroun (Marmon), won; Dawson (Marmon), second; Gilchrist (Stoddard-Dayton), third. Time, 5:49 3-5.

Seventh (five miles, free-for-all handicap)—Hughes (Parry), 25 seconds, won; Harroun (Marmon), scratch, second; Endicott (Cole 30), 25 seconds, third. Time, 6:05. Nine starters.

Eighth (twenty-five miles, for cars of 161 to 230 piston displacement)—Endicott (Cole 30), won; Edmunds (Cole 30), second.

Race B free-for-all cars—Harroun (Marmon), won; Dawson (Marmon), second; Gilchrist (Stoddard-Dayton), third. Time, 28:33. Six starters.
