A. officials who will have charge of the running of the big race watched the time tests. They were Fred J. Wagner, starter; S. M. Butler, chairman of the contest board and A. R. Partington, referee.

Sunday the track will be washed. The drivers will be permitted to practice Saturday and Monday, preceding Burman's time trials, which will be held Monday morning, the financial proceeds of which go to charity. Burman will try to break the record for the mile, two-mile and kilometer in his big Benz. The track will be closed from Monday at noon until the start of the race Tuesday at 10 o'clock.


