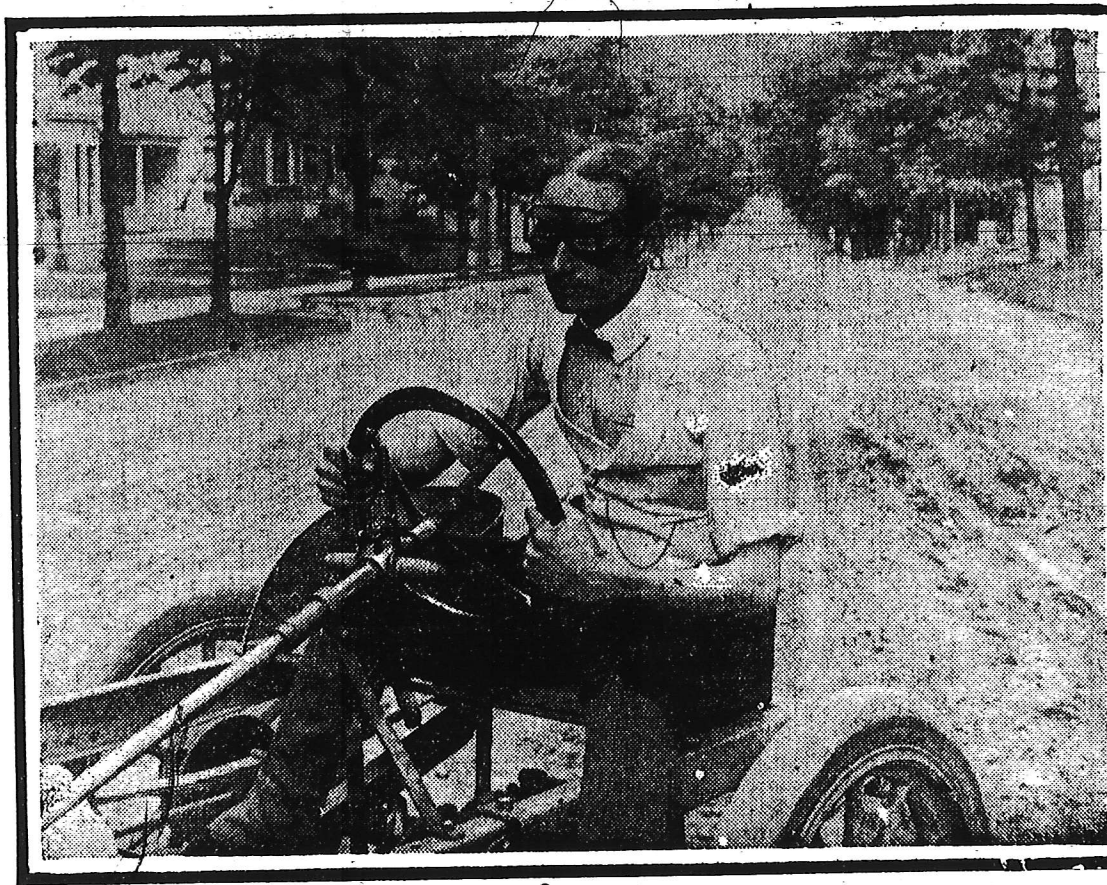

LEWIS GIVEN DECISION

DOUGHERTY FLOORED TWICE

Right Hook to Jaw Sends Milwaukee's Favorite to Floor for Count of Nine—Both Men Finish Strong.

MILWAUKEE, Wis., Oct. 19.—Harry Lewis of Philadelphia won the decision over Jack Dougherty of Milwaukee before the Milwaukee Boxing Club tonight after ten rounds. The former had the battle won all the way.

A nasty left jab, which Lewis worked effectively in the start, kept Dougherty from getting in his famous right, on which the followers of the local boy counted so much. Lewis excelled Dougherty in cleverness and in only one round, the third, did Dougherty appear to have the advantage.

Lewis dodged many hard swings that Dougherty sent in wildly, at the same time snapping Dougherty's head back with short jabs that kept the blood flowing from Jack's nose continuously. Only in two rounds, the third and tenth, did Dougherty appear to get to the Easterner.

In the concluding rounds Dougherty, who had decided that he could not stall off Lewis long enough to land a knock-out punch, started to mix matters and for a time he had the Easterner hanging on to save himself.
